

Expert Working Group: Composition

- Co-Chairs (volunteers): Two or more co-chairs are designated for each working group on recommendation of the LPSA Advisory Board Chair to lead the working group's activities (and prepare the WG's annual work plan)
- Working Group Coordinator (part-time): Supports the co-chairs to coordinate, manage and implement the activities of the working group
- Core Working Group Members: The co-chairs may designate specific Core
 Working Group Members, who take an active role in advancing the objectives
 and activities of the working group
- Working Group Members: All LPSA members who opt into the working group (see next section)

How to Elevating the Debate?

- Knowledge development: Developing knowledge products (e.g., primers, explainers, analysis) that expands the knowledge and understanding of the global community of practice on issues related to decentralization and localization
- Knowledge sharing: Sharing cutting-edge policy research, up to date information on country-level policy reforms, projects, or innovative subnational / intergovernmental practices (e.g., through EWG meetings, blogs, roundtables, webinars, etc.) that expand the knowledge and understanding of the global community of practice on issues related to decentralization and localization
- Elevating the debate by elevating the knowledge of new or junior practitioners in the community of practice, or sharing experiences within and across different global regions
- Outreach, convening, field-building development and sharing: Elevating the debate by introducing actors in adjacent practice communities to the importance of multilevel governance and the potential contributions of subnational actors to inclusive governance and sustainable development

Expert Working Group: Main Responsibilities

- Meet on a regular (e.g., bi-monthly or quarterly) basis.
- Propose 4-6 blogs per year on country-level policy reforms, trends, institutional updates, or research relevant to their topic or focus, for sharing to the broader Community of Practice through Decentralization. Net.
- Host at least 1-2 webinars per year on issues relevant to their topic.
- As relevant, prepare, co-produce or share knowledge products that reflect the current state of knowledge in their respective area of focus.
- For instance, regional Expert Working Groups may support the preparation of LoGICA / InFER Assessments within the region, support the preparation of report on the State of Local Governance in the region, and/or the collection of other country level data in the region.

Diversity, Equity and Inclusion of EWGs

- The Local Public Sector Alliance (LPSA) is committed to engaging with all stakeholders (government officials, policy makers, practitioners, scholars, civil society representatives and citizens) without regard to age, ancestry, disability, national or ethnic origin, race, religious belief, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, marital or veteran status.

 - Concretely, we aim for global regional diversity and gender equity in every aspect of LPSA's work, including the leadership of LPSA Working Groups

3. LPSA EWG membership management & communications (MS365 & Mailchimp)



LPSA is a "virtual" global alliance: MS 365 keeps us organized and connected


Every core LPSA team member (including each EWG Coordinator) has an MS365 account

- SharePoint / OneDrive (file sharing and storage)
 - Public OneDrive folder for EWG, for PPTs, video files, blog subfolder, meeting subfolder
- Microsoft Office Suite (Word, PTT, etc.)
- Outlook Email (...@decentralization.net)
 - Email can be set up as a forwarding account (e.g., to multiple co-chairs) if desired
- Teams (video chat, etc.)

In addition, each EWG (both the WG Coordinator as well as one of the co-chairs) is provided with a LPSA Zoom account (meetings up to 300 participants)

As part of MS365, every LPSA EWG has its own SharePoint Site

- Facilitates file sharing among group co-chairs and coordinator (and selected members, if desired)
- Allows for file sharing with LPSA Secretariat
- Can be linked for easy access from OneDrive
- Main folder structure is standardized/ aligned with LPSA program structure



LPSA Membership and EWG Membership is managed through MailChimp

Current LPSA Membership (May 2023): 1,350

- Every LPSA Member opts into one or more Expert Working Groups as part of the registration process
- Members can add/change EWGs using the MailChimp Registration Center
- The Program Manager uses the subscriber database to send LPSA Connections Newsletter (bi-monthly: Jan/Mar/May/Jul/Sep/Nov) as well as Special Announcements (generally in the off-months)
- EWGs can request Program Manager to send out targeted announcements to registered EWG members



LPSA's online platform: Decentralization.Net

- Decentralization.Net is a WordPress website
- The current ambition of the LPSA Secretariat is to post at least one blog for every region and one blog for every thematic/research area every two months on Decentralization. Net (aligned with newsletter cycle)
- In principle, the EWG Coordinator will post blogs to D.Net on behalf of the EWG; the DNEt Editor (Program Manager) can assists in posting blogs
- Alternatively, any EWG (co-)chair (or any LPSA Member) can be made a DNet Contributor (and be provided with a WordPress account)
 - Draft blogs reviewed and approved by the DNet Editor (Program Manager)





EWG Landing Pages for each region / thematic area

Each EWG has its own dynamic landing page on DNet. Each EWG landing page:

- 1. Links to recent blog posts on the region / topic (dynamic content)
- Links to Expert Working Group news and updates (e.g., upcoming meetings, meeting minutes, etc.), (dynamic content)
- 3. Any other content (static or dynamic) can be added based on EWG inputs (and within what is possible by WordPress) e.g., links to recent EWG webinars



Events Calendar

- Decentralization. Net features an events calendar
- The EWG Coordinator (or DNet Editor or LPSA Program Manager) can add EWG meetings, webinars, or other related events to the Dnet Events Calendar
- Alternatively, any DNet Contributor can post events on their own
 - Detailed guidance for DNet Contributors developed separately
 - Draft events reviewed and approved by the Program Manager

5. Quarterly EWG meetings: scheduling and meeting structure content (Zoom or Teams)



Quarterly EWG Meetings / Scheduling

- LPSA EWGs are requested to plan their meeting approximately one year ahead (to prevent conflicts with other LPSA activities)
- The EWG Coordinator will
 - Set up Zoom meeting (with pre-registatrion)
 - Line up interpreter as needed
 - Add EWG meetings to LPSA's Events Calendar
- LPSA Program Manager will send out reminder to EWG members about 1-2 weeks in advance
- It is suggested the each EWG records their regular meetings
 - LPSA Program Manager can assist with post-production and upload to YouTube;
- EWG can prepare LPSA Update blog post to either share video (or meeting summary) with Working Group members

Regional EWG Meeting Agenda (Illustrative)

- 1. Meeting Opening (EWG co-chairs)
- 2. Updates from the Community of Practice (designated rapporteurs)
 - a. LPSA Updates (Updates from LPSA Secretariat; other EWGs)
 - b. General regional news and updates (e.g., new/ongoing country reforms)
 - c. Development Partner updates (major new projects; project highlight)
 - d. Research, thematic reforms and NGO updates (major new studies/campaigns; research highlights)
- 3. Topic Discussions (50 minutes) (EWG activities; LoGICA; Webinars; other topics of interest to EWG members)
- 4. Any other business / next steps (10-20 minutes) (upcoming EWG events; topics for next meeting; etc.)

Each working group can decide how / whether to mix working group discussions and content discussions, or whether to have separate content-related events

6. EWG Knowledge development, knowledge sharing, outreach, convening and field building (including webinars)



LPSA organizes two types of webinars

- 1. Global webinars (more formal / managed by LPSA Secretariat)
 - Typically in partnership with others (Forum of Federation; DeLOG; etc.)
 - Hosted on LPSA's Zoom webinar account / managed by Secretariat
 - E.g., Elevating the Decentralization Debate webinar series (3-4 / year)
 - Could be used to 'elevate' selected regional/thematic webinars for global audience
- 2. Regional / Thematic webinars (more informal / managed by EWGs)
 - Preferably at least 1-2 per year [1 may be elevated to global webinar]
 - On topics identified by EWG (but open to global public)
 - Hosted on EWG's Zoom meeting account / managed by EWG
 - Backstopping provided by LPSA Secretariat (Webinar Coordinator/Program Manager)

LPSA EWG Webinars: Planning & Scheduling

- Preferably 1-2 per year; preferably plan and schedule webinar (and/or roundtable, etc.) 2-3 months ahead
- Schedule webinar in EWG Zoom Meeting Account
- Line up interpreter(s) as needed
- EWG prepare LPSA Update blog post to announce webinar / event
- Inform LPSA Webinar Coordinator (Program Manager) to ensure added to Events Calendar; Newsletter announcements; Reminder emails
- EWG is encouraged to record webinars (LPSA Secretariat supports postproduction and posting to Youtube)
- EWG prepares blog post with link to video and/or event summary

LPSA EWG Workplan Guidance

- Each working group is encouraged to prepare a written annual workplan (typiocally July-June) to clarify:
 - Objective of working group
 - Identify priority areas for the working group to 'elevate the decentralization and localization debate'
 - Key (potential) stakeholders / audience
 - Proposed working group knowledge development, knowledge sharing, and outreach activities, including dates for quarterly meetings
- An optional / illustrative template is available for LPSA Working Groups
