

Participation

- Result: Budapest lags behind Warsaw and Madrid when it comes to participation rates.
- Limitation: Participation growth might lead to the deterioration of the quality of ideas and the deliberation process
- Conclusion reached: To increase participation, the allocation of more funds is necessary, but only while ensuring citizens are properly informed.




Impact on budgetary decisions

- Result:
 - The impact of the Budapest PB on budgetary decisions is significantly smaller than that of Warsaw and Madrid.
 - People are not aware of the cost of implementing certain ideas.
- Limitation: Due to relatively low participation, some organizations with good mobilization capacities can "hijack" PB
- Conclusions reached: People need to be properly informed and empowered.



Representativeness

- Result: Due to lack of data, it is hard to draw any conclusions.
- Limitation: Is representativeness actually important?
- Conclusions reached: The Budapest PB is the only process out of the three that promotes PB's original goal of redistributing wealth and supporting poorer neighbourhoods.








Savings-based PB

Based on German processes, where citizens decide on where to save instead of where to spend.



School PB

Introducing PB in schools to teach them about the logic of budgeting and the importance of active involvement in decision-making.
